

What is the Radical Health Festival Helsinki?

At the heart of digital transformation

The event was driven by a genuine and shared ambition to transform healthcare, deliver value, improve clinical and financial outcomes, and make health systems sustainable.



The list of challenges facing health systems is only getting longer - ageing populations, workforce shortages and burnouts, rising lifestyle-related cardiometabolic diseases, unsustainable payment models, siloed information, lack of focus on prevention,

25+ partners have joined the movement including the European Society of Cardiology, SITRA, CHIME, Frontiers, H-ISAC, TEHDAS, COCIR, IANPHI, EHTEL and the Reference Sites Collaborative Network

Under the patronage of 3 Finnish Ministries: Social Affairs and Health, Foreign Affairs, and Economic Affairs and Employment)











Healthy, Active and Productive Ageing Health and well-being derive from the interaction between individual, community and environment. The twin digital and environmental transitions require an effort to overcome the boundaries between disciplines, organizations and sectors to improve our understanding of the mechanisms that underpin successful ageing and healthy life course trajectories.

Insights from Large Scale Implementations across Europe

This session highlights innovative approaches identified by the RSCN reference regions, that could be deployed at scale in several fields:

- □ Risk factors (clinical, personal well being, environmental/other) to tackle at individual, community and environmental level to improve health outcomes
- ☐ Organizational readiness to implement integrated care sustainably
- ☐ Complex care and cure services in the community and at home
- ☐ Health promotion policies across sectors external to social, health and care
- ☐ Engaging non-professional stakeholders (citizens, patients, students) into an active participation in the delivery of new service models
